A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer Third Sunday After Trinity – June 28, 2020

The Ten Commandments - In the coming weeks we will review the six chief parts of Luther' Small Catechism. The first is the Ten Commandments, God's law. It sets before us the righteous demands of God for his people, that when met, allow them to draw near to God and not die. In our fallen and sinful condition, the law kills. It only shows us our failure in that we cannot keep God's good and perfect law. As you read Exodus chapter 20 take note of the response of the people when God speaks to them from inside the cloud. There is no joy that God has spoken to them, only fear! They know that when God spoke to them it would bring death. This after the first words God spoke describing His love and mercy for them shown in His bringing them out of Egypt and freeing them from slavery. The Law shows us our sin and our need for a Savior, that is Christ Jesus. With faith in Christ we are set free from bondage to sin and death and are given peace with God.

Jesus has perfectly kept the Ten Commandments and all of God's law and done it FOR YOU! This he has done to become the perfect sacrifice for our sins to win us from the power of the devil.

Read the Ten Commandments and their meanings in the Small Catechism with your family. Discuss how we try but fail in keeping them and give thanks to God for His Son that has don't it all for us.

Are you desiring the Lord's Supper? Times will continue to be set aside for individuals and families of our congregation to receive absolution and the Sacrament for the forgiveness of sins and strengthening of their faith. Daily Prayer LSB pp 294-298 Pray and confess out loud **Daily Prayer – For Individuals and Families** as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Include the Apostles Creed before The Lord's Prayer if the setting you regularly use does not include it so as to confess it daily. Learn by heart the catechism, and hymn of the week.
