The Sacrament of the Altar

Advent Evangelical Lutheran Church teaches and believes that through the body and blood of Jesus Christ, offered under bread and wine in the Lord's Supper, God gives to His children the forgiveness of sins. Since this is a sacred meal, Advent distributes the Lord's Supper to communicants who have been prepared to receive it.

If communing, please prepare using pp. 308, 329-330 found in the front of our Hymnal.

- If you are a member at an LCMS parish, please speak with one of our pastors beforehand so that they may greet you and inform you accordingly regarding our practice.
- If you are a visitor and have not been confirmed or hold to a confession of faith that differs from Advent and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, please refrain from receiving the Lord's Supper. You may come forward during Distribution to receive a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.
- **Distribution** If communing, at the appropriate time in the Divine Service, please approach the altar via the center aisle. When directed to a position at the rail, bow and kneel without waiting (you may also stand as needed). After you receive the Sacrament (or blessing), please stand, bow, and return to your pew via the side aisle. The final blessing will be made at the end of the distribution and the covering of the elements.

Please see an Usher for help locating:

- Hearing assistive devices for use during worship are available in the Narthex.
- Wheelchairs are available upon request.
- Restrooms are located to the left of the Narthex as you enter the church.
- The Nursery and Cry Room provide quiet places for active or crying children and are equipped to broadcast our services.

Coffee & Donuts served every Sunday between the early and late service in the Fellowship Hall.

Join us for Sunday School & Bible Study Sunday morning in the Fellowship Hall. We begin at 9:35am and conclude at 10:30am.


SIXTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

Today's Readings:

1 Kings 17:17-24 Ephesians 3:13-21 Luke 7:11-17

Jesus Calls forth Life from Death

A large funeral procession carrying the only son of a widow is confronted by another large procession, Jesus and His followers. Death and Life meet face to face at the gate of the city (Luke 7:11–17). Filled with compassion, Jesus comes into direct contact with our mortality in order to overcome it. He touches the coffin and speaks His creative words of life, "Young man, I say to you, arise." Jesus does what is neither expected nor requested. For



through Christ, God the Father "is able to do far more abundantly than all we ask or think" (Eph. 3:14-21). Jesus bore our death in His body that we may share in His resurrection. Even as Elijah stretched himself out three times over the Zarephath woman's son (2 Kings 17:17-24), God stretched Himself out over us in the threefold application of His name in the baptismal water, breathing new and everlasting life into us. "To Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

The Will of God Is Always Best Hymn of the Day LSB 758

All the Readings for today speak comfort. The Introit begins with our prayer for God's grace in our cries "all the day" long (Ps. 86:3). In the worst moments of life, faith insists that the Lord is good, "abounding in steadfast love to all who call upon [Him]" (v. 5).

The author of this hymn was most likely Albrecht von Preussen (1490–1568). J. S. Bach employed this text (sts. 1 and 4) in his cantatas. The first stanza masterfully weaves together so many Scripture passages of hope and comfort. As we learn to pray, so we learn to sing, "Your will be done" (st. 4). This is not a hopeless surrender to what we cannot control, but the positive affirmation that those who trust in the Lord are already blest. God cannot forsake His children, marked for Him in Baptism, who live by faith. His discipline is a mark of love lest we be lost to unbelief or impenitence. In the second stanza, the faithful are described as vielding to God's "counsel, wise and just." Stanza 3 prays that the Lord would give us strength in the face of temptation. Stanza 3 may not have been original, and some add a doxological stanza when omitting this stanza. Note how the certainty of death is admitted in stanza 4, but just as certainly is confessed the final victory and eternal life we have in Christ. This hymn text is an eloquent statement of God's grace and a call to trust in the Lord in the darkest of circumstances.

Fri: Pray for the preaching of the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for its spread throughout the whole world, especially in our community; and for the persecuted.


